CURATOR'S REPORT

THE BERLIN AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY

FEBRUARY 12, 2013

Four of us volunteers spent the afternoon of February 4 placing address labels on 182 post cards that were mailed out the following day to members whose dues for 2013 were overdue. It's a yearly process that brings in a large percentage of dues from the members who were slow or slipped up in sending in their payments. The cost of a post card increased one cent to 34 cents per card late in January Although the Berlin Post Office placed an order for 34 cent stamps and a quantity of one cent stamps about January 12, they had not received their supply of either one by the time our cards needed to be mailed. We purchased two rolls of 33 cent stamps but unfortunately Berlin Post Office was out of one cent stamps. That was all right with me – it gave me an excuse to revisit the Somerset Post Office where I retired from ten years ago! Stew, Gary, Anna Mae and I put both the address labels and a 33 cent stamp on each of the cards during our volunteer hours. The following day I purchased the one cent stamps in the lobby of the Somerset Post Office. I enjoyed the opportunity to sit at the little table in the Somerset lobby – relaxing and savoring the opportunity to watch the customers interact with former co-workers working the window while adding an additional penny stamp to each card.

This picture of Cyrus Musser and his son, Albert "Keffer" Musser – both Berlin area building contractors – was donated to the society in January by your curator. The picture was taken in 1908 after the men had decorated their horse-drawn buggy and horse for one of the parades held in conjunction with Berlin's Old Home Week celebration. Rediscovering the picture provided inspiration to do some research and eventually put together a story about the men's contracting business. We're eager to know about structures in the Berlin area that were constructed by the two men or by a third generation contractor, Chester Musser – who was a son of Albert "Keffer" Musser.
