#### Berlin High Wins 59-24 OverFaculty

The schoolboys were trailing 7-4 at the end of the initial frame. They then scored 22 markers in the second period to take a 26-9 command at half-time, which they widened to 45-15 at the finish of the third stanza.

Glessner, and Saylor. This quartet tallied 46 of the varsity's scoring.

Specicher, garnered seven points, on two buckets and three conversions for second high laurels. Center Hay was


next in line with two fielders.




LARRY PRITTS donated several pictures of Goodtown including some mining pictures. His wife, Grace (Nicholson) Pritts grew up in this former mining community.

uth Clark graduated in 1959

High School where she was in the Business Class. Not much is known about Ruth other than she was living along

the Mud Pike in Brothersvalley Township in the home of George Aaron and Edna (Brant) Stahl at the time of her graduation.

According to her obituary, Ruth married Leo Krater one week after escaping Pennsylvania. Leo was a quadriplegic, kind hearted, and always thought the best of others. Ruth cared for him for 58 years and her comment was always, "I wouldn't change a thing." Leo preceded her in death. They had no children.

Ruth worked at JC Penney in Pueblo, Colorado for 30 years in the accounting department.

It was difficult to learn where Ruth was making her home at the time of graduation. She was likely a foster child of the Stahl family with a foster sister being Shirley (Stahl) wife of Floyd Airesman. Laverne (Suder) Coslic remembered riding the same school bus and Ruth boarding the bus at the George A. Stahl farm house. Laverne recalls another girl by the name of Betty also getting on the school bus at the Stahl farm.

Ruth's classmate Carol (Miller)
Leydig remembers Ruth being a quiet girl
and having something to do with the
Airesman family. Detective work hed to
learning that Ruth lived with the George and
Edna Stahl family.

Jed Curzi's Stonycreek Township Vikings turned closely fought first half into a second half shellacking as they walloped Vernon Lease's Somerset township passers 61-21 in a class B county playoff staged on the Somerset high school hardwood before a full house.

The Vikings will travel to Bedford Thursday night to battle the Everrett high school eagers for the District Five title

The game started out fast with both teams trying hard to put their team in the winning column. The Vikings scored first on a foul by Mussen. The Vikings took the first period 14-10. The second period found both teams matching shots with the Vikings taking a slim 8-7 edge to increase their lead to 22-17 at half time. The second half was all Vikings as their smooth passing and brilliant shooting shellacked Friedens as they threw wild passes that mostly went out of bounds. Friedens lost Eddie Trent in the beginning of third period on fouls whom they missed. The last period saw the Vikings dump in 21 points while the Friedens passers were held scoreless.

John Grenke sparked the Vikings scoring attack with 14 points of which 13 came in the second half. Ken Lowry and Don Baltzer also played brilliant ball and each finished second on the scoring list with 12 marker each.

Ronald Pile tallied seven points for the losers best offensive scorer.

Stonycreek gets the tap with both teams starting out fast. Musser makes a foul which was followed by Baltzers field goal for a early 3-0 fead.
